

Cape Breton Fun Facts

- Cape Breton began as Camp Eagle, run by Joseph M. Child. The campers lived in pyramidal tents. Our present day clubhouse was the dining hall and housed the camp counselors.
- Cape Breton was developed by the Van Ness Corporation in the 1930's. But, Van Ness Drive was not included in the original tract of land that made up the association. It wasn't added until much later.
- The first stockholder's meeting was held on July 4, 1943.
- The first president of the association was James Hoffmeier.
- The operating budget in 1945 was \$2,167.26; less than a twentieth of our current operating budget.
- The membership dues in 1945 were \$15 annually.

In anticipation of the 75th Anniversary celebration, Gene Donatello, the Township historian, will be presenting a slide show and talk about beach communities along the Metedeconk river during the formative years. This has not been scheduled as yet, but will to take place in mid July. A flyer will be distributed once the date has been finalized.
